COMPLETED: 11TH ALLEY PROJECT

A stormwater project was recently completed in 11th Alley at the intersection of Piedmont Avenue to control storm water during rain events by installing 250 feet of corrugated pipe, 3 catch basin inlets, and 1 manhole. Baiano Construction completed the project with minimal disruption to traffic patterns. This project will address stormwater flooding issues near the intersection of 11th Alley and Piedmont Avenue. The 11th Alley project was completed entirely with funds from the stormwater management fee.

GRANT AWARDS

The Dormont Stormwater Authority was awarded 2 grants in the latest round of Allegheny County Gaming Economic Development Fund (GEDF) grants. The grants will be used to complete projects on:

Athens Alley Watershed - \$185,000

This project upgrades the storm sewer system at Kelton Ave. and W. Liberty Ave. including installation of 530 LF of new pipe, 4 inlets, and 2 manholes.

LaSalle Ave/Louisiana Ave - \$200,000

This project upgrades the storm sewer system including 1,350 LF of new pipe, 6 manholes, and the installation of 11 inlets.

WINTER STORMWATER TIPS PREVENT POLLUTION

DO

Do pile snow in locations with the most opportunity to infiltrate into the ground.

Do clear away snow that has been thrown onto the storm drains.

Do pile snow where water does not pond.

DON'T

Don't shovel snow into the street where contaminants will make their way to storm drains, catch basins, or manholes.

Don't pile snow onto rain gardens, bioswales, or bioretention areas.

Don't use deicing road salt when temperatures are 15 degrees or below – it doesn't work!
