



How Can You Support Stormwater Management?

Dispose of hazardous materials properly	Do not pour hazardous liquids down the storm drain, since storm drains are connected to local creeks and streams.	Make sure that sewage and other waste is not flowing into the storm water system.	Illicit discharge of hazardous materials includes: oil, grease, gasoline, chemicals, sediments, detergents, and products containing chlorine.
Limit use of fertilizers and pesticides	Make sure not to use fertilizer when there is a forecast of heavy rainfall.	Conduct a soil test to see if fertilizer is necessary for your yard.	Look for natural alternatives to pesticides.
Properly dispose of yard waste	Keep grass clippings and leaves out of storm drains and culverts.	Use clippings and leaves as compost.	Use mulching lawn mower that recycles grass clippings and leaves into the yard.

**W. Liberty Avenue
 Parking Lot – Rain Garden**

Four bids were received and opened for the W. Liberty Avenue rain garden on April 13. The Board accepted the lowest bid in the amount of \$73,295 from Ramsey Construction at their regular Board meeting on Wednesday, April 20, 2022. The scope of work includes installation of a rain garden along the north end of the parking lot, pavement restoration, plantings, concrete curb, and restoration. The project will be completed sometime early in June.
