### WINTER STORMWATER TIPS PREVENT POLLUTION

#### DO

Do pile snow in locations with the most opportunity to infiltrate into the ground.

Do clear away snow that has been thrown onto the storm drains.

Do pile snow where water does not pond.

#### DON'T

Don't shovel snow into the street where contaminants will make their way to storm drains, catch basins, or manholes.

Don't pile snow onto rain gardens, bioswales, or bioretention areas.

Don't use deicing road salt when temperatures are 15 degrees or below – it doesn't work!

### Did you know?

Leaves can be a great source of nutrients for your property – consider mulching them into your yard or garden.

Normal snow accumulation does not pose a threat to rain gardens so there is no need to shovel your rain garden.

More salt does not equal more melting snow – follow product instructions and sweep up any material remaining after the snow/ice melts
