Did you know? A deciduous tree retains about 20% of the rain that falls on its canopy and can control 4,000 gallons of stormwater in a year.



FALLING LEAVES AND STORMWATER

Autumn is marked by falling temperatures, falling rain, and falling leaves. Celebrate the fall season with a focused effort on leaf clean up. The Borough's leaf vac and removal efforts are well underway, and you can do your part.

- Keep sidewalks, curbsides, and stormwater drains clear.
- Rake leaves and place them in yard waste or compost bins.
- Use a mulching mower designed to shred grass and leaves into small pieces that add nutrients to the soil.

Fall foliage may be a traditional and beautiful part of Autumn, but untended leafwaste impairs water quality and sewer pipeline systems.
